

Green is My Favorite Color

Yellow + Blue = Green Activities

Cooking

You will need:

1/2 Pre-cooked ham Green food coloring Slow cooker
Eggs (2 per person) Large skillet

- *Set slow cooker to High and cube the ham into bite-sized pieces.
- *In a large slow cooker, add pre-cooked ham and stir in green food coloring
- *In a large skillet, cook scrambled eggs and stir in green food coloring.
- *Once the eggs are completely cooked, combine with the ham in the slow cooker.
- *If needed, add more food coloring to achieve the desired green color.

Art for Younger Students

You will need:

Liquid glue White construction paper
Yellow and blue tissue paper Paint brush Small container

Give each student a small container filled with liquid glue, a paint brush, one sheet of both yellow and blue tissue paper and white construction paper. Have the students tear the tissue paper into small pieces. Next, the students will glue one yellow and one blue piece of tissue paper on top of each other by spreading liquid glue on top of each piece with a paint brush. As the students mix the two colors together, the glue will begin to turn green. To achieve a darker green color, continue to add tissue paper and glue.

Art for Older Students

You will need:

White construction paper (3 per student)
Black construction paper (2 per student)
Yellow and blue water color paint and paint brush

Have your students cut two sheets of black and two sheets of white construction paper into long strips. Demonstrate how to create a lattice work pattern by alternating the black and white strips and gluing on the third white construction paper. After the entire sheet is covered in a checkerboard pattern, have each student paint half the sheet yellow and the other half blue. Where the two colors meet, the students will combine the two colors to create the color green. The more paint they use the darker the green will appear.
